

AGYC Community Survey - February 2023

As we have the past few years, the Strategic Planning Committee will again publish a Community Survey.

The surveys of the past have provided our community with valuable information regarding the demographics and the prevailing opinions and priorities of AGYC members.



This year's survey will be primarily focused on the long-term goals of our community so we may best plan for the anticipated changes coming to AGYC in the next ten years or so -- changes such as the growth in population, changes in demographics and priorities. This survey is intended for LONG TERM PLANNING PURPOSES ONLY! No funding decisions or expenditures of any kind are to be approved without the majority approval of the AGYC community through the prescribed voting procedures.

Please complete the on-line survey. It requires just a few minutes of your time. An email blast containing a link to the on-line survey will be sent in early February. For those who prefer a paper copy, this format will be available at the AGYC Business Office. Your participation in the survey will be noted to validate one response per lot, but your responses will be disconnected from your address information, so your responses will remain anonymous. Please encourage your AGYC friends and neighbors to complete the survey as well. The greater the community participation the more inclusive the information provided.

Although surveys provide excellent information, they do not provide a totally comprehensive picture. The Strategic Planning Committee will also hold a Community Workshop for all who are interested as we further evaluate and define the requirements for our long-term planning.

The schedule of our current plan is as follows:

- ⇒ Phase One: Define long-term requirements through survey results and sponsor a Community Workshop to be held in March.
- ⇒ Phase Two: Develop a plan prioritized to accommodate the requirements as defined in Phase One over the next 10 years. To be completed by May 2023.
- ⇒ Phase Three: Create a funding schedule for any planned projects based upon prioritization and timing of available funds via a Pro-Forma. Phase Three is to be completed by January 2024. This funding schedule will be dependent not only on the priority to the community but also to the timing of funding availability.
- ⇒ Phase Four: Create a funding initiative based on the Phase Three plan to be included on the FY2024/25 ballot (May 2024) for approval by the AGYC community.

To be truly successful, strategic plans must be dynamic. They require consistent review and amendment based on changes not anticipated when they were initially developed. Many assumptions we make now will likely change in the coming years. Inflation, demographics, population and resources are all factors which need to be reviewed and evaluated as we continue to plan for the future of AGYC.

As I reflect on another golf season on the horizon I go back to where it all began and the most influential person that helped create what we enjoy today. His name is Dwane Ehrich.



Dwane was raised in the Creswell, Oregon area and excelled in Track and Field. He got his start at Emerald Valley Golf Club in Creswell before making his way to Alderbrook in December of 1984. Dwane was chosen as the new Golf Course Superintendent and he

and his wife Theresia sold their home in Cottage Grove and arrived at Alderbrook. In the years following Alderbrook started its ascent from a sleepy summer cabin golf course into the makings of what we have today.

Dwane led with high energy, passion for his craft and a willingness to do whatever it took to create the best golf course he could muster. Soon the crew started to take shape as I came on board in 1989 followed by Darren Sweitzer (94), Robert Jonker (94), Paul Brown (95) and Brent Starr (99) . The core 5 we presently have had formed. We all were drawn into the golf course profession by Dwane as his love and commitment to Alderbrook was second to none. His energy was the driving force that we fed off on those days when getting to work everyday before 5 a.m. could wear on a person in their 20s who stayed out a little late the night before.

Dwane taught us not only about golf course management but also commitment to family. So much so that our crew became a team and family all combined. Dwane inspired us and made us all feel like being a part of the Alderbrook "Green Team" was the most important title one could have. After the tragedy of 9/11 in 2001 the world started to change a bit. Before you know it Dwane was the Superintendent at Tumwater Valley Golf Course and I was a young Superintendent carrying on the mission. Dwane would always gather us together a few times a year and his mission statement was pretty simple: "Give the golfer the best version possible of Alderbrook for that given day. Imagine a person coming hours to play here for the first time and you want to impress them so much they tell everyone about this hidden gem known as Alderbrook Golf Course."

Fast forward to 2019 and Dwane is diagnosed with multiple myeloma which is cancer of the plasma cells in bone marrow (bone cancer). Dwane continued to lead at Tumwater Golf Course until his retirement roughly a year ago. Currently Dwane is on his sixth round of chemotherapy. He has been building his and Theresia's dream home together that overlooks Hood Canal and is quite serene and beautiful from the pictures I have seen.

Dwane and Theresia have been together going on 50 years now. They truly are an American love story through and through. Dwane has always been an avid hiker and has hiked many of the mountain range peaks



we see from the 18th green. He has two daughters, Samantha and Alexan. Alexan is a local artist and engaged to be married later this summer.

Dwane is taking on life like only he knows how, with positive energy and the love and support of his family and his dog by his side. Take it from me, if you run into Dwane out and about and think you are going to cheer him up, good luck, as he will always cheer you up many times over your best efforts to do the same.

In closing please say a prayer for Dwane and also for yourself that you get the chance to cross paths with him on a hiking trail. He changed my life for the better and I can speak for my core 5 as well. The world needs more Dwane Ehrichs and here's hoping and praying we get to keep the original around another 20 plus years.





AGYC's Scotch Broom Eradication Campaign

The Environment Committee is sponsoring an AGYC Scotch Broom Eradication Campaign from March 6 - June 6, 2023.

Even though scotch broom provides beautiful yellow blooms, it is an invasive, toxic and noxious plant that restricts native plant growth.

We are in the process of scheduling a speaker from the Mason County Noxious Weed Control Board in February to provide an overview of

scotch broom, the impact it has on our environment and the removal process.

Our campaign is coinciding with the opening of the Organic Collection Site in March. A dumpster for the sole purpose of scotch broom collection will be located at the OCS during this campaign period for proper disposal. It is imperative that scotch broom

is removed before it sets seeds. Each shrub can produce over 10,000 seeds a year that remain viable for many years. Scotch broom needs to be disposed of in your trash or taken to the OCS dumpster and should not be put in your compost.

We will be coordinating with
Mason County Noxious Weed Control Board to
borrow their levering tools for periods of time during
this campaign. As you walk through AGYC, scotch
broom is in many of our common areas, as well as
on personal property. Everyone needs to be
responsible to control the spread of this noxious
weed. Please assess your property, remove and
dispose properly. During our campaign, specific
dates will be identified so we, collectively, can
make a greater impact removing scotch broom.
Working together, we can help maintain
Alderbrook's beauty and charm and better preserve
"our hidden gem."

Thank you to all of our dog walkers who regularly pick up litter as they are walking their dogs, and to these residents who make regular trips on our roadways to pick up litter!


