



Golf Course Loan Special Assessment Progress Report

We are pleased to report that 100 members have already paid their \$400 Special Assessment as of July 24, allowing the Board of Directors to authorize two \$20,000 principal prepayments on the golf course loan.

AGYC will continue to pay down the loan balance as additional Special Assessment funds are received.

The balance on the golf course loan was \$326,373 on May 31, 2024. After the June and

The Special Assessment was overwhelmingly approved by the membership on the June ballot. Although payment is not due until February 28, 2025, the sooner members are able to pay the Special Assessment, the quicker we can save on interest charges and pay off the loan.

Cruise The Canal CAR SHOW



Planned Ditch Clearing and Culvert Pipe Cleaning

By AGYC Roads & Drainage Committee

Policy:

The goal of the Roads & Drainage (R&D) Committee is to maintain all AGYC-owned roadways in good order and free from hazards. This includes, but is not limited to, ... drainage and other conditions that affect the overall status of all roadways and adjacent rights-of-way.

. . .

No structures, hard landscaping or vegetation is allowed in the rights-of-way that may impede the natural flow of water, interfere with emergency vehicle use, interfere with AGYC road and/or maintenance vehicles, or hamper pedestrian access. Where such impediments may exist, AGYC retains the right to remove, at the owner's expense.

(CCRs Sec 3; Bylaws Article I, Sec. 3 & 4; P&Ps Sec 7.0, Paragraph O; App F, Requirements.)

* * *

Plan:

During the past 5 years, our HOA roads have received a phenomenal facelift! Now, it's time to focus on maintenance, starting with overgrown ditches, unidentifiable culvert pipe inflow/outflow, and pipes that are crushed, plugged or too small. In the past year, R&D has inspected all the roads in the HOA to identify the areas needed serious attention. With a limited budget, R&D has identified the following areas, also shown on the attached map:

- Westwood Lane West cul de sac area;
- 2. South side of Country Club Dr E, between Beach Drive and Country Club Place;
- 3. East side of Vine Maple, from Michelle Drive to the intersection of Susan Lane/Vine Maple Lane;

4. Michelle Drive, from Vine Maple Lane west to 311 E Michelle:

- 5. Blackberry Court
- 6. West side of Vine Maple, from Dogwood Lane to Dogwood Court; and
- 7. Madrona Lane, north side

Services to these areas may include clearing and cleaning ditches, tree removal (in ROW only), replacing/repairing crushed or inoperable culvert pipes, clearing culvert pipes of debris, and observe runoff/drainage patterns.

If your home is in an area to be addressed in 2024, a flyer will be delivered to your home.

If you have decorations, landscaping or rock in the culvert ditch, it may be removed to allow access for the vector truck. If you have special items in the ROW, beyond your front property line, please take the steps to remove them, or the contractor will need to remove to complete the project.

This is EPAC's 8th installment of "Prepare in a Year". There is no summer break when it comes to disaster preparedness. While enjoying some fun in the sun give some thought to Utility Safety.

Propane: Portable tanks should **not** be stored in buildings, garages or other enclosures. Don't store a spare tank under your grill. Never use it indoors or in unventilated areas. When not in use keep the tank valve turned off. **Do** store tanks upright. Permanently installed tanks should be serviced on a regular basis.

Electricity: Know where your electrical circuit box is located and teach all family members how to shut off electricity to the entire house. Make sure younger family members know not to use electrical appliances with frayed, cracked or damaged cords, broken plugs or housings. Don't run electrical cords under rugs. Don't nail or staple cords to walls, floors or any other objects.






Summer is here.


While there may be some more unexpected bumps, indicators show that the market is returning to more stability, which is helpful for home purchasers.
