

We are preparing for the holiday season in the Clubhouse. The Activities Committee and member volunteers helped decorate the Clubhouse. This is always a fun way to start the season, and their work is greatly appreciated. The trees will go up the first week of December, so be on the lookout.

We are revamping our schedules, reducing shifts and possibly looking at layoffs. Our largest expense will always be labor, so it is a constant juggle to manage that expense properly without the membership experiencing any changes in service.

In February we will be conducting a F&B workshop for all who are interested. Our goal is to talk about the restaurant and operations, but more importantly, what do you as a member want at the Clubhouse for food and beverage service. We will send out more details in the coming weeks when we have a finalized date.

Reid also shared that if he won a million dollars, he would buy a new set of golf clubs, because as any golfer knows, clubs make the golfer.



Your AGYC Board met on Monday, November 25, 2024 and acted on the following:

- Ratified removal of one (1) danger tree at 190 E Susan
- Approved making a \$17,500 principle-only payment to the Golf Course Loan to be taken from the Special Assessment funds in the Golf Course loan restricted account
- Approved the P&P edit to delete Community Garden from the Environment Committee's responsibility

Approved the Alderbrook Properties request to combine their lot numbers 31, 32 & 33 and 36, 37 & 38 into two (2) separate tax parcels. This approval is granted with the understanding that no trees will be cut within 10 feet of the newly created property lines, if possible, excluding a 25-foot driveway entrance. Our intention is to save as many trees as possible. Grounds for this approval include maintaining the appeal of a "tranquil and forested community" and mitigating the potential damage to Beach Drive and downhill properties from storm water runoff and landslides

Important Reminder: Golf Course Special Assessment Payment By Mary Gin Kennedy



to pay off the Golf Course bank loan was approved by ballot this past June. As a reminder, your \$400 one-time, lump sum payment is due by February 28, 2025.

Payment may be made by check; through your monthly ACH transaction; by credit card (3% service fee) or in cash. If your Special Assessment is not paid by the due date, interest and late fees will accrue, as with any overdue payments to AGYC.

A Special Assessment To date, 45 percent of the Special Assessment has been collected, or \$106,750 of the \$240,000 to be raised. Through November 25, the Board of Directors has authorized an extra \$105,000 for principal prepayments along with our normal monthly payments. We encourage members who are able to make the \$400 payment to do so now. By paying sooner than later, AGYC can continue to make significant principal prepayments every month from Special Assessment funds, thus lowering the loan balance and saving on interest.

New Ad Hoc Committee to Tackle Policy and Procedure Non-Compliance

AGYC has a new committee to address the issue of members' lack of compliance with AGYC Policies and Procedures. Committee Members include Tracy Battson, Curt Creswell, Ron Edwards, Tracey Lopez and Rick Reclusado.

The Policy Compliance Committee was born out of member concerns. In the past, AGYC Policies and Procedures, which are well written, lacked enforcement. This results in confusion because some neighbors are familiar and adhere to policies and procedures and others don't.

Most of you have heard the conversations "Why have policies and procedures if they are not going to be enforced?" How come John and Beth (John and Beth are fictitious) are allowed to ... (choose your policy/procedure violation here)?

We have all chosen to live at Alderbrook and, by extension, adhere to the Homeowners Association

(HOA) Governing Documents. All HOA's have policies and procedures which need to be followed. If they are not consistently, and fairly enforced, the quality of life we were seeking when we moved to Alderbrook will eventually decline.

No one wants to be heavy-handed regarding policy/procedures being enforced. Ideally, voluntary compliance is preferred. Perhaps you are unaware of being in violation of a particular item, or perhaps you don't agree with the policy. In a perfect world just being reminded of a policy would be enough to correct the violation. Unfortunately, there will likely be instances when a fine is necessary. Hopefully, these instances will be few and far between.

Procedures for handling non-compliance with our Governing Documents can be found in our policies and procedures. Please review the AGYC Governing Documents to familiarize yourself with our policies and procedures, including Appendix H, Fine Schedule and Appendix D, Construction Guidelines.

Recycling Plant Tour

Like many of you, I feel good about filling our blue recycling container every other week. But we wonder, "How much of this stuff gets recycled, and how much ends in landfills? Are our efforts a futile attempt to make us feel good about ourselves, or are we doing a good thing?"

To answer these and other pressing questions, eight of us representing the Environment Committee put down our shovels, rakes and loppers and toured the Pioneer Recycling Plant in Tacoma (the destination for Alderbrook recycling).



We came away mesmerized by the complex maze of conveyor belts, screens, computers. blowers, robots and human handlers turning a conglomeration of bottles, cans, newsprint and cardboard into neat bundles. ready for transport to industries capable of turning our recyclables into new products.

In fact, Pioneer Recycling (now under the auspices of Waste Connection) boasts a 90% recycling rate at its Tacoma plant - and almost all of its intake is similar to what we put into our blue recycle containers.


Some information we came away **SPizza boxes**: That grease you with that might be useful as you fill your recycling bins:

Plastic: Only items with 1, 2 or 5



on the bottom live to see another day; others end up in landfills. Leave caps on water/soda bottles. Don't waste water rinsing out containers (a sponge-wipe will do).

Aluminum cans: A gold mine for recyclers since aluminum is easily recycled; however, please



don't crush your cans because the sensors may mistake them for glass.

Glass: Not explicitly allowed in your recycling bins, so please take glass separately to the transfer station on McReavy Road. Any glass you put into your blue recycling container will likely die in a landfill.

- see on your box disqualifies it from getting recycled. Cut off the pizza-stained cardboard and throw it away; recycle the clean cardboard.
- Grocery bags: Plastic grocery bags will end up in a landfill; however, if you put them in a grocer's recycle pile (e.g., in front of Fred Meyer, Shelton), it has a very high chance of living to see another day. Better yet, use reusable bags.
- Shredded paper: Even if you put shredded paper into a paper bag and label it as such, it's unfortunately not going to be recycled; a better chance is put that bag in the paper container at the transfer station.

WINTER PLAYING RULES

I didn't know! Did you? Since we will be playing in weather that will not be ideal for golf in the next four months, I thought I would look at some rules that are misinterpreted during winter golf. These three surprised me.

Repairing ball marks: You can repair ball marks on the green at any time before putting but you cannot repair a ball mark on the fringe, even if it is in your line of play.


Temporary water: When the weather turns nasty and temporary water accumulates on the putting green, you are entitled to relief on your line of play if your ball is on the green. However, if your ball lies off the green, you are not entitled to relief from water on the green and you will have to either chip it or hope for the best playing through it.

Sand and loose soil: Sand and loose soil can only be removed on the putting green and not elsewhere on the golf course if it would improve the conditions affecting your next stroke. For example, if you are on the fringe next to a bunker and there is sand on your line in the fringe, do not be tempted to remove it because this is not allowed. You may always remove any sand on your line on the putting green, though, regardless of whether or not your ball lies on the putting green.




Hood Canal Plungers

Alderbrook Fauna Focus: Golden-crowned Sparrow By Kelly Haupt, AGYC member



Stepping outside as the sun rises on Alderbrook, one is greeted by birdsong. Some songs vary with the seasons, and some can be heard any day of the year. But how do we know which birds we are hearing? By using an app, of

course! The "Merlin Bird ID by Cornell Lab" is a brilliant app which allows you to record birdsong happening around you, and by the recorded sonogram, Merlin will identify the birds!

Why take the time? My sister and author, Lyanda Lynn Haupt, says "Birds will give you a window, if you allow them. They will show you secrets from another world, fresh vision that, though avian, can accompany you home and alter your life. They will do this for you, even if you don't know them by name – though such knowing is a thoughtful gesture. They will do this for you if you watch them."

In autumn, our Golden-crowned Sparrows arrive from Canada and Alaska, where they spent their summers. These birds are very vocal and have a loud and striking song: A high pitched, descending slurred whistle of three notes, in a minor key, often described as "oooh deear mee!". If you've ever tried to grow grass from seed in the fall, good luck, as these birds will arrive in numbers to gobble it up! A large and plump sparrow, compared to our common year-round Song Sparrow, this bird handsomely sports a gray head, with a black cap starting at the eyeline, topped with a golden-yellow crown. They are often busy on the ground in our yard, feeding on seeds, insects, worms and grubs.



While these birds are not here to nest, they do so in thickets on the ground during their breeding season up north. Enjoy them in Alderbrook, where they are readily seen, and heard, all fall and winter long!


Never leave candles unattended. Always extinguish them before leaving the room or going to bed.

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


