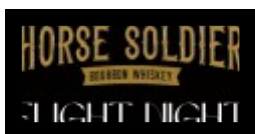

- 👉 Approved making a \$10,000 principal only payment to the Golf Course Loan to be taken from the Special Assessment funds in the Golf Course loan restricted account

Important Reminder: Golf Course Special Assessment Payment

A Special Assessment to pay off the Golf Course bank loan was approved by ballot this past June. As a reminder, your \$400 one-time, lump sum payment is due by February 28, 2025. Payment may be made by check, through your monthly ACH transaction, by credit card (3% service fee) or in cash.

If your Special Assessment is not paid by the due date, interest and late fees will accrue, as with any overdue payments to AGYC. To date, one-third of the members have paid their Special Assessment. We encourage members who are able to make the \$400 payment to do so as soon as possible. By paying now, AGYC can continue to make significant principal prepayments every month from Special Assessment funds, thus lowering the loan balance. Through October, the Board of Directors has authorized an extra \$87,500 for principal prepayments.

Message from the President of the Board of Directors

Hello Fellow AGYC Members:

In July, an initiative petition related to removal of trees on the golf course was presented to the Board of Directors and was referred to the Election Committee in August. This initiative was signed by at least 5% of the members. AGYC's Policies and Procedures require the HOA to hold a vote to adopt or reject this initiative.

AGYC members in good standing (one vote per lot) will be asked to vote on this initiative petition in a ballot to be mailed out in early November. To be adopted, the initiative petition must be approved by a majority vote (50 percent plus at a sanctioned membership meeting). This sanctioned membership meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, December 4, 2024, at 6pm to allow ample time for the Election Committee to mail the ballots and have them returned.

The Board of Directors held a Golf Course workshop on August 2 as part of our efforts to understand future development of our golf course. The Board of Directors also invited a respected USGA agronomist, Larry Gilhuly, to visit the course on August 20. He evaluated and made recommendations regarding the future

maintainability and playability of our course. We emailed his report to the community on September 10 and included it again in an email blast announcing a second workshop on November 6 at 6pm at the Clubhouse when Mr. Gilhuly will present his findings and recommendations. The purpose of both workshops is to provide AGYC members with a clear understanding of any plans or changes being considered for the golf course.

The Board of Directors encourages all members to attend the November 6 workshop to become fully informed and aware of the how the Board of Directors intends to consider and implement any changes to our golf course and to ensure we are taking the best care of our most valuable asset. Not only does this initiative directly impact how the association is governed, but it also sets a precedent of how AGYC may be governed in the future.

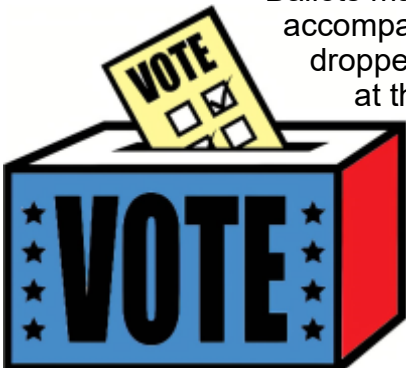
The Board of Directors also encourages all members to vote in the election to approve or disapprove this initiative petition.

Unveiling 60 Years of AGYC's History

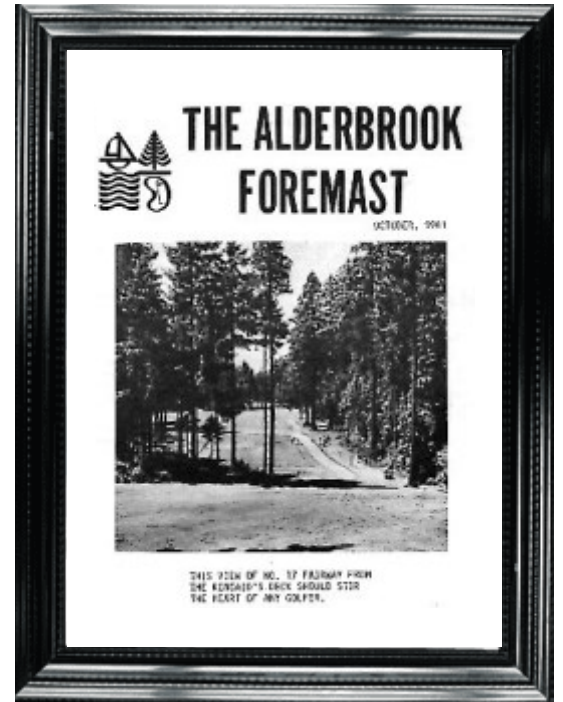

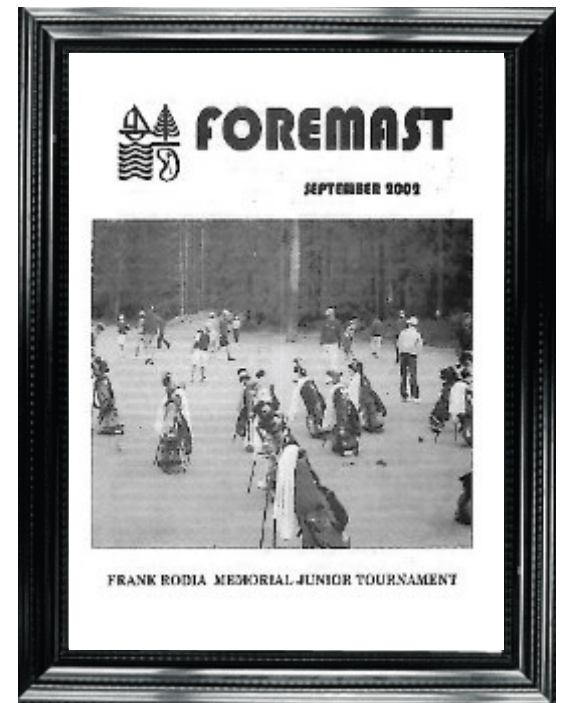

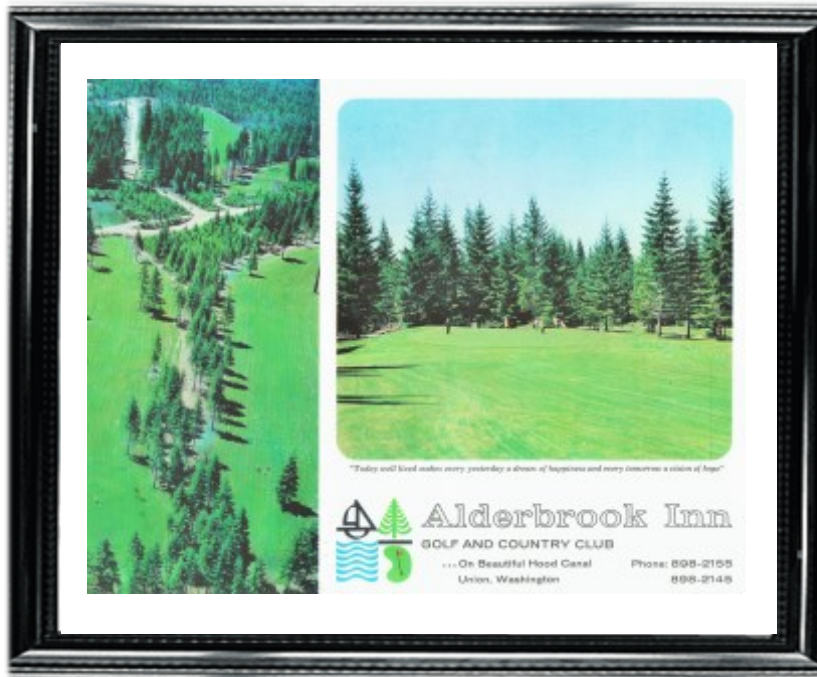

Junior golfers practicing putting at the Frank Rodia Memorial Junior Tournament as seen on the cover of the September 2002 Foremast



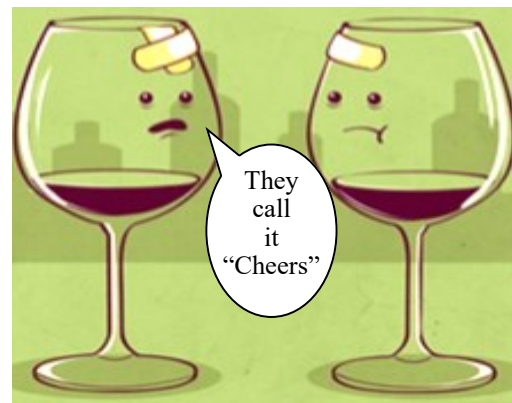

EPAC (Emergency Preparedness Advisory Committee) By Heather Boone, Member

Welcome to month 11 of Prepare in a Year!



There are many different emergencies that may require you to shelter in place. Sheltering in place is not the same as staying indoors. It means creating a safe room in your home to protect yourself from natural disasters, active shooter situations, pandemics and chemical hazards. If it is too late to evacuate, or the situation outside doesn't allow for safe evacuation, government officials may issue a shelter-in-place order. Or you may find yourself in a situation where you are in immediate danger and need to determine the best course of action. Use common sense and available information to assess the situation and determine whether you should shelter-in-place.

Creating a safe room takes planning. Here are some tips for sheltering in place:

-  Local authorities may not immediately be able to provide information on what is happening and what you should do.

-  Pay attention to local media outlets for official news and instructions as they become available.
-  Bring your family and pets inside.
-  Lock doors, close windows, air vents and fireplace dampers.
-  Turn off fans, air conditioning and forced air heating systems.
-  Take your emergency supply kit unless you have reason to believe it has been contaminated.
-  Go into an interior room with few windows, if possible.
-  Seal all windows, doors and air vents with thick plastic sheeting and duct tape. Consider measuring and cutting the sheeting in advance to save time.
-  Cut the plastic sheeting several inches wider than the openings and label each sheet.
-  Duct tape plastic at corners first and then tape down all edges.
-  Be prepared to improvise and use what you have on hand to seal gaps so that you create a barrier between yourself and any contamination.

“Sealing a room” is considered a temporary protective measure to create a barrier between you and potentially contaminated air outside. This type of sheltering in place requires pre-planning, by purchasing plastic sheeting and duct tape that you would keep in your emergency supply kit.

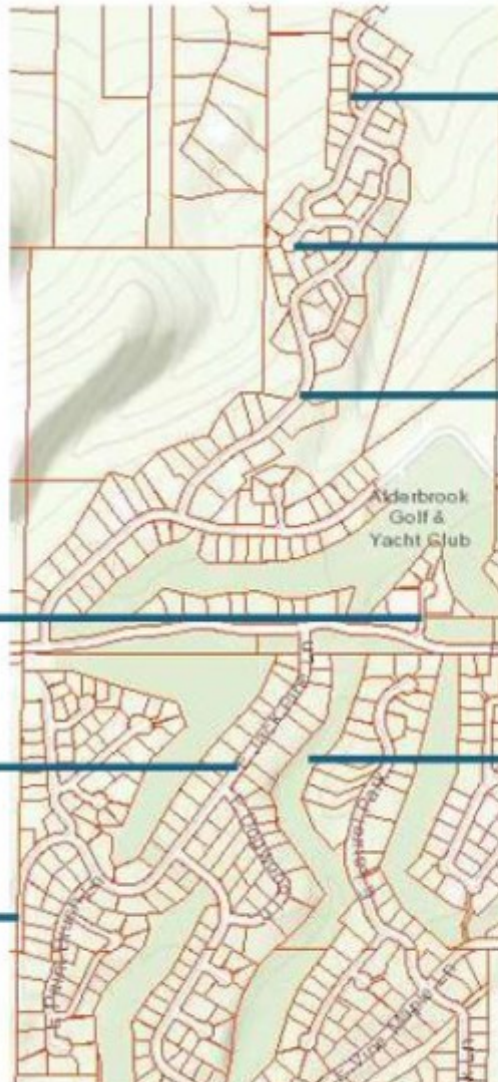

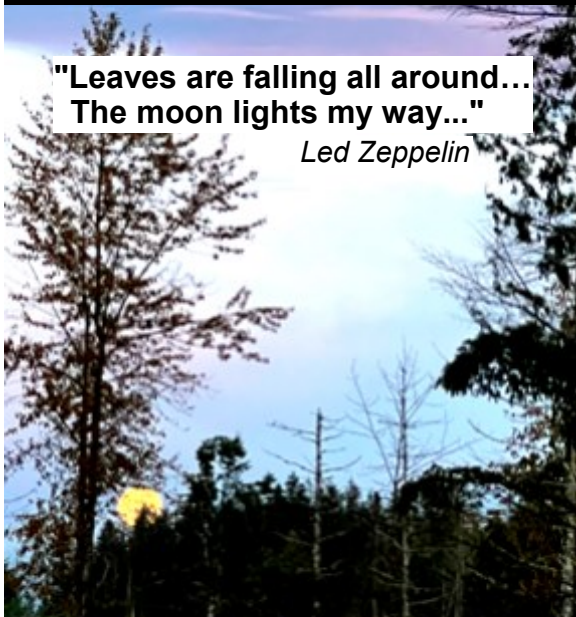

At Alderbrook we strongly prefer that cart traffic is reduced to the path and the rough. The fairways are fragile and have been a decades long program of topdressing and seeding to provide the best fairway conditions possible. Our fairways are ryegrass and the roughs are an overseeding hybrid of Ryegrass and Fescue for durability. Driving down the middle of the fairways is counterproductive to our goal of creating the most pristine fairways under our budget restrictions. The 90-Degree Rule is the best way to help preserve our fairways throughout the golfing seasons.

After a fantastic summer of incredible weather and lots of golf, October simply didn't keep the trend going. Hopefully November will bring us some more good golfing weather heading into the Holiday Season.

Starting November 15, the posting season will officially be over until the golf season starts back up in the spring. However, if you play in a warm weather PGA section such as Arizona or Hawaii, you must post scores for any rounds you play in those areas.

November 15 will also mark the start of **Snow King and Queen**. With your handicap being frozen for the winter. We will take your best four net scores (18 holes for Snow King and 9 holes for Snow Queen) for the competition. There can be no temporary greens for the round to count and you must play with another member or guest to attest your score. The competition will be \$10 per player and sign up is inside the Golf Shop.



Be Prepared for Winter Golf

- ◆ Make sure you dress appropriately for the conditions and bring an extra layer.
- ◆ With the lower temps and extra layers your golf ball will not fly as far as it does during the summer. Make sure to play up an extra club or two.
- ◆ Play a golf ball that you can compress. We have several great options in the Callaway Super Soft and the Srixon Soft Fell. Both are excellent options for winter play.
- ◆ Lastly, make sure to check out the soft spikes on your golf shoes as they may have been worn down during the summer.

Keep these in mind while playing some great winter golf!

Turkey Shamble

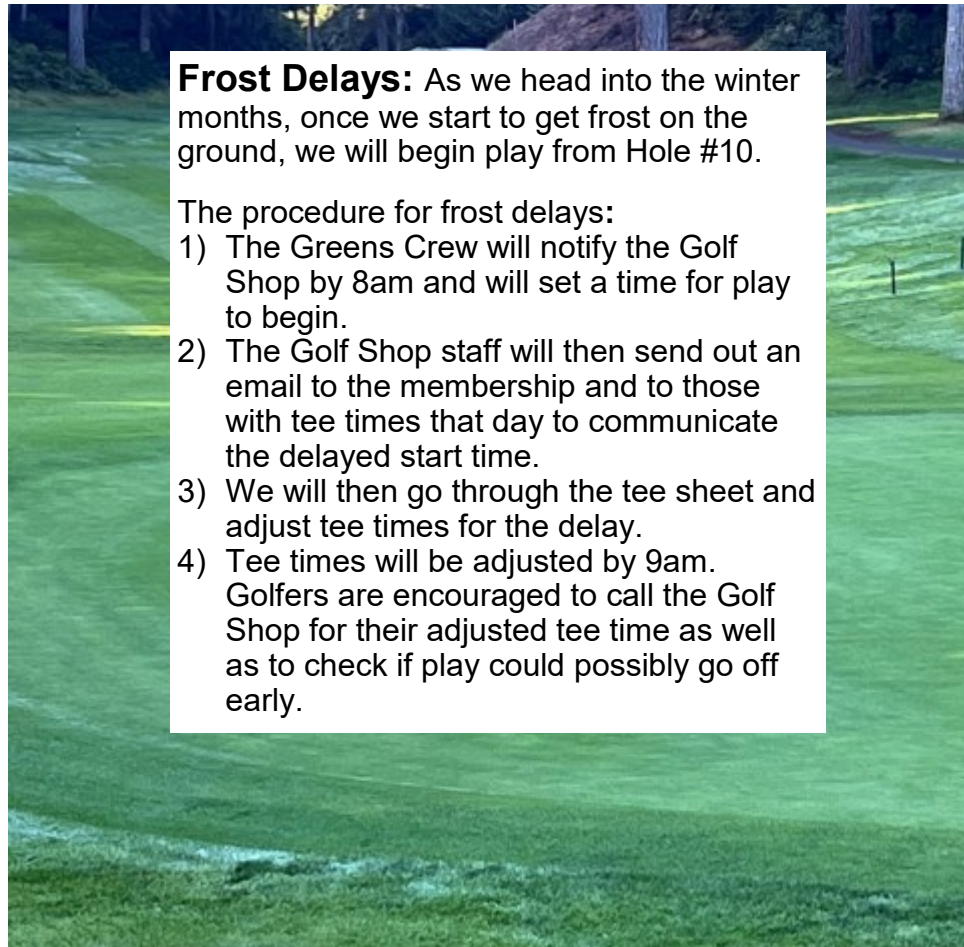
Friday, November 22 we will have our first holiday tournament of the season - the Turkey Shamble.

- ◆ 2-Player Shamble Best Ball, both players tee off on each hole, select the best tee shot, and play their own balls in from there
- ◆ Team scores will consist of the best gross and net score on each hole between partners
- ◆ Teams will be required to use four tee shots per player
- ◆ Shotgun start at 10am after a breakfast buffet served at 8:30am
- ◆ Entry fee is \$40 per player, which includes your breakfast and prize money

Frost Delays: As we head into the winter months, once we start to get frost on the ground, we will begin play from Hole #10.

The procedure for frost delays:

- 1) The Greens Crew will notify the Golf Shop by 8am and will set a time for play to begin.
- 2) The Golf Shop staff will then send out an email to the membership and to those with tee times that day to communicate the delayed start time.
- 3) We will then go through the tee sheet and adjust tee times for the delay.
- 4) Tee times will be adjusted by 9am. Golfers are encouraged to call the Golf Shop for their adjusted tee time as well as to check if play could possibly go off early.

Spend Your Club Credit Please

Our establishment will be switching our Point of Sale system from Tee Snap to NorthStar at the start of the New Year.

We are asking members that have club credit on the books to spend their money by December 20 to make the transition easier when the time comes to transfer all our data, numbers and any club winnings to NorthStar. Members may use their club credit inside the Golf Shop and the restaurant.

I am currently working on getting all my winter apparel orders plus additional inventory in at once to provide the membership the opportunity to spend their club credit by the end of the year. Members may also use their club credit for custom orders. We have accounts with most major golf companies

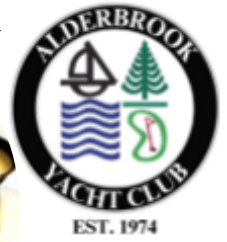

Alderbrook Fauna Focus: Washington Snowshoe Hare By Kelly Haupt



If Elmer Fudd visited Alderbrook, he'd surely be excited about all of our *wascally wabbits*! When we moved here and first noticed these bunnies, we could see right away that they were not the Eastern Cottontail rabbits

Our Alderbrook Washington Snowshoe Hare population sure seems healthy in numbers! They are much less secretive and nocturnal than those living in wilderness areas. In the spring, look out for "leverets," or young hares, which look like miniature adults. Aren't we lucky to have the opportunity to enjoy these hares? We sure think so!

we were used to seeing in Snohomish. They were larger, darker and with some unique markings: black around the ears, and a white "star" on the forehead. These are the markings of a subspecies of Snowshoe Hare, the Washington Snowshoe Hare (*Lepus Americanus Washingtonii*).

In general, hares differ from rabbits by being larger, with longer ears and longer hind legs. What distinguishes our Pacific Northwest subspecies group from other hare populations is that they keep their dark brown fur all year, while others will turn white or mottled white and brown in winter. Their hind legs have thick fur, which can act as snowshoes, helpful indeed for populations making their home in Olympic National Park. They are also found in southern coastal British Columbia.

The Real Estate Outlook By Alderbrook Properties



Since mid-summer, the housing market has provided some mixed signals but with encouraging trends. Housing starts rebounded in August after hitting their lowest levels in four years, signaling renewed

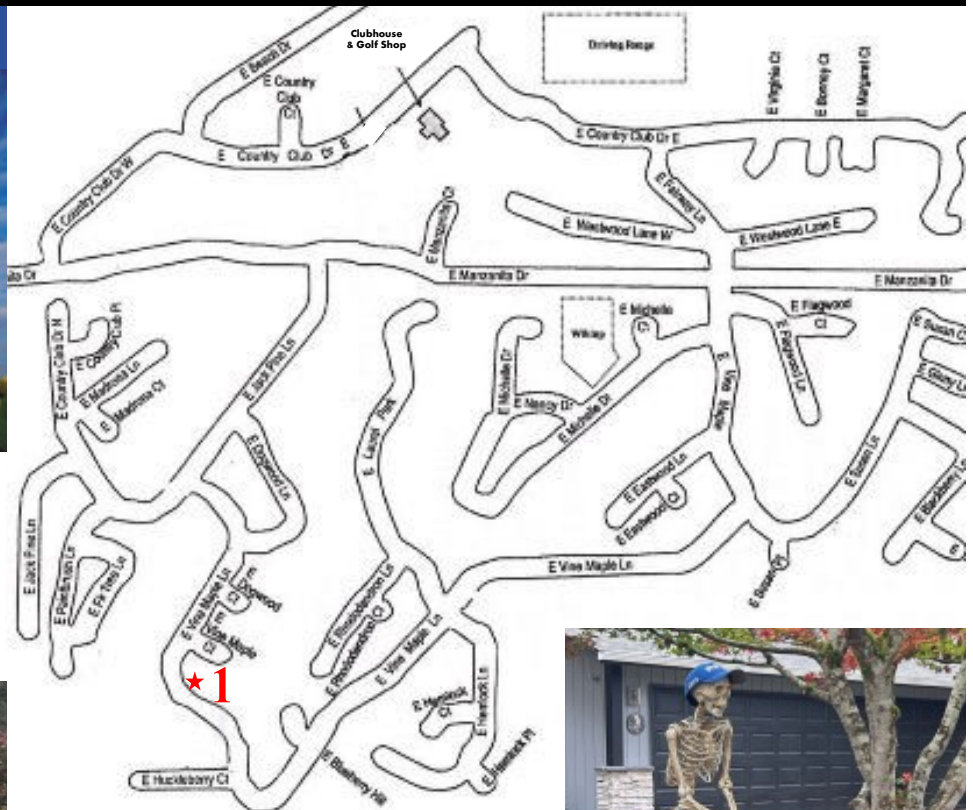
construction activity. On the other hand, existing home sales dipped more than anticipated, weighed down by high mortgage rates and elevated home prices. New home sales surged, up 10% year over year for August, reflecting increased buyer interest in freshly built properties - something we've also seen locally.

The positive momentum is continuing here in Mason County. Homes are selling faster, with the average time on the market now just 24 days, compared to 28 days at this time last year. Additionally, September saw a rise in the number of homes sold - 89 compared to 83 last year - indicating that demand remains steady despite broader market challenges.

As Robert Dietz, chief economist for the National Association of Home Builders, aptly said, "It's been a more challenging outlook... But there are some bright spots." Indeed, while headwinds persist, there's reason for cautious optimism, with local and national trends pointing toward resilience in key housing market areas.
